# Seminar on "Current Topics in International Trade"

The aim of the seminar is to discussing some of the current key topics of international trade policy from an economist's point of view. We will try to understand why we can observe substantial current account imbalances and what, if any, actions are needed to adjust them. We will examine examples of trade wars from the past and what we can learn for the modern debate. Furthermore, we will examine how global value chains are changing by choosing selective case studies and in what way the geographical fragmentation of production processes may impact carbon dioxide emissions.

The seminar will make you aware of ongoing policy discussion at the national and international sphere and give you an understanding of why the attitude towards globalization has recently become quite diverse within and across countries.
